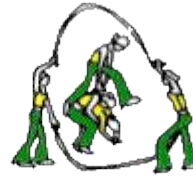
QLD Skipping Championships 2007

The QLD Skipping Championships were held over 2 days at the end of July. It was the largest numbers of skippers to compete at a QLD Championship. A total of 145 skippers competed from 6 QLD clubs, and 1 NSW Club. There were numerous skippers competing for the first time. It was great to see the young age brackets full with 34 skippers competing in 8 & under, and 45 skippers competing in 9-10. There was also a noticeable increase in the male skippers with 15, spread through the age groups. It was a successful event, with an increase in competitors, and clubs from last year.

QRSA Regional Competition

Queensland Rope Skipping Association launched its first ever-regional competition beginning in March this year. Three competitions were held, with over 120 competition skippers, from 7 clubs represented throughout the three events. Age groups completed various speed & master events, split over 3 rounds. A local skipping club hosted each round. It was a great build up to the QLD Championships, and the last competition was held on the 26 August.

From around the World

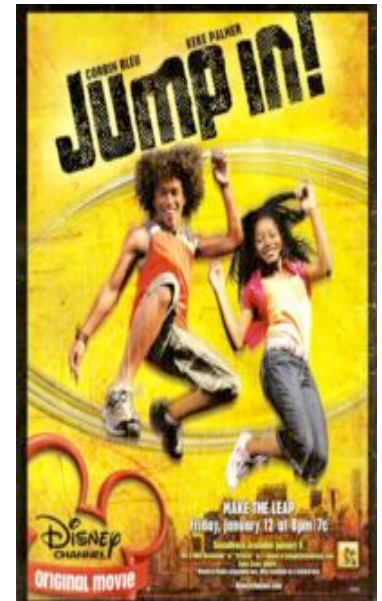
The 2007 European Championships were held in the Netherlands in June. 45 teams competed, with Belgium winning all gold and silver medals. Hungary won 2 bronze medals for Junior Girls & Senior Girls. Germany won a bronze medal for Senior Open and UK won bronze for Junior Open.

USA rope skippers set 4 new world records in June 2007. Tori Broggs set a new WR in Female 3 minute speed with 492. The Summerwind Skippers from the USA set 2 new WR in team speed with 362 in the Open Single Rope Speed Relay, and 410 in the Open Double Dutch Relay. The Double Dutch Forces team also set a new WR of 440 in the Open Double Dutch Pairs Speed.

Rope Skipping comes to Foxtel

Foxtel's Disney channel has launched the new series Jump In! She is a competitive double dutcher, and he's a trained boxer. After being asked to substitute for a team member at a Double Dutch competition, he discovers a hidden passion for rope skipping.

It also featured Luke Boon, who became the Open Men's World Champion at the 2006 World Rope Skipping Championships in Canada.
